## Synopsis of "Celebrating 50 Years of Airmail Service to Bermuda: A FDC from 1975 and Maybe One from 1925?"

Significance/ Objective:	To introduce readers of <i>First Days</i> to a seminal event in the history of airmail to Bermuda – namely, the two flights of the airship USS <i>Los Angeles</i> in 1925 – and to provide evidence supporting the existence of a Bermudian First Day Cover (FDC) carried on a flight of the <i>Los Angeles</i> from Bermuda to Lakehurst, New Jersey, April 23-24, 1925.
Originality:	The Airpost Journal and the Bermuda Post have run articles on the Los Angeles, but First Days has not. First Days also has not carried any articles on the Bermudian FDCs that celebrate the Los Angeles. Those include the FDCs with which I open and close the article (Bermuda Scott 319 from April 28, 1975, and Bermuda Scott 444 from October 13, 1983, respectively).
	In addition, an extensive search of philatelic literature uncovered no research or articles concerning the existence of a FDC for the 1-shilling "Caravel" stamp printed on olive-colored paper (Bermuda Scott 48a). Although I was unable to definitively prove that April 13, 1925, was the first day of issue for that stamp, I offer compelling circumstantial evidence.
Research:	I did extensive research into back issues of <i>First Days</i> , <i>Airpost Journal</i> and <i>Bermuda Post</i> for articles on the <i>Los Angeles</i> and the "Caravel" stamp issue. For detail on the printing varieties of the "Caravel" issue, I relied on M.H. Ludington's <i>The Postal History and Stamps of Bermuda</i> . For my discussion of the <i>Los Angeles</i> 's flights, I partially relied on the <i>Airpost Journal</i> articles cited under "Resources," but I also used information gleaned from contemporary sources such as <i>The New York Times</i> , <i>Royal Gazette</i> , <i>Colonist Daily of Bermuda</i> , and <i>The Postal Bulletin</i> . I also asked members of the Bermuda Collectors Society to review a draft of this article. (Note: The part of the article in <i>First Days</i> on the 1925 FDC was printed in the <i>Bermuda Post</i> , October-December 2024, Vol. 38, No. Whole No. 152, pp. 4-7.)
